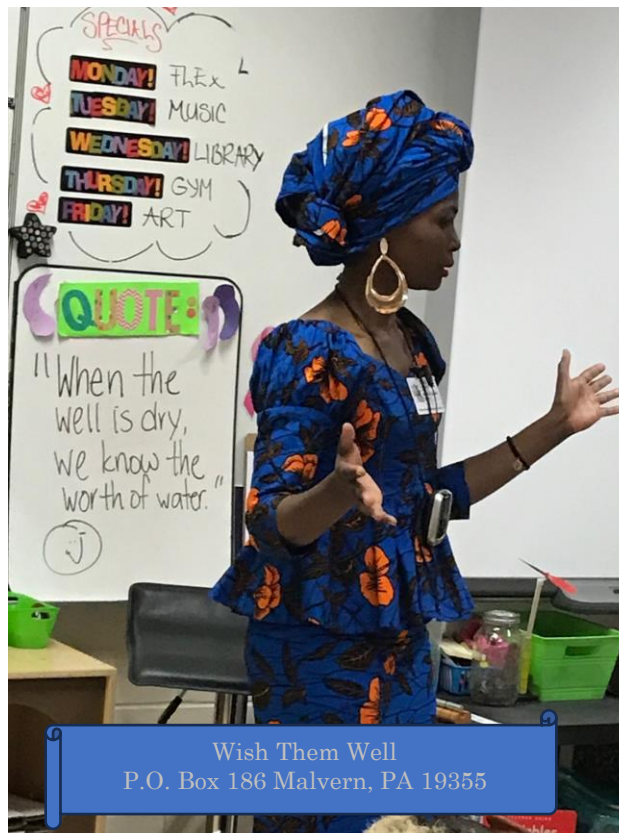
## How Can Students Learn More About WTW?

## Educational Resources

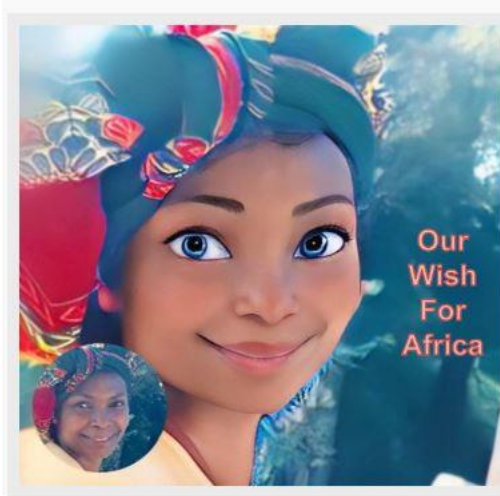
